	<p>Maintain social distancing within the playground, according to the government's latest advice.</p> <p>Manage any potential risk of high traffic touch points on the play equipment</p>	<p>Consider limiting the numbers of children that can safely use the play area at any one time and use signs to communicate this to users, parents, guardians or carers.</p> <p>If the playground is too busy advise parents and carers to use the other playground or come back later and use signs to communicate this to users, parents, guardians or carers.</p> <p>Advise all users to wash hands before entering the playground and after they have finished. Use hand sanitiser often. Encourage parents to bring hand sanitiser gel or wipes to clean their children's hands.</p> <p>Promote cleaning of equipment by users, parents, guardians and carers, particularly where there are clear touch points.</p>	Parish Clerk	14 August 2020	14 August 2020
